

Barony of Trugharacmy Tirocha = centred, quarter Aicme = Tribe, group

CASTLE ISLAND

- 1226 Castle built by Geoffrey De Marisco (Strongbow's nephew 218)
- 1236 Gave castle to Fitzgerald as part of dowry.
- 1236 Before (Everlynt H.) St Finian's Church in use
- 1231 Letter from Henry 3 To The Constable of Castleisland to the effect that "William Marshall, Earl of Pembroke, your Kiege Lord is dead. Freely deliver up Castleisland to Waterford Fenton to whose keeping we have committed the castle + lands.
- 1250 Dominicans came to Castleisland (founded Spain 1216) } Dominican nuns Kilbarri. Lived in St. Stephen's Church
- 1329 Maurice Fitzgerald created first Earl of Desmond (Chambers Biographical)

1345 Castle captured by Sir Ralph Ussord, Lord Justices of Ireland. Castle held for Maurice FitzThomas Fitzgerald, 1st. Earl, by Sir Eustace de Poer, Sir William Grant, Sir John Cotterel.

1397 Gerald The poet, 4th Earl, murdered near the castle. (75)

1422 Indenture between Lord James Fitzgerald, Earl of Desmond and Walter Fitzmaurice FitzThomas to answer the said earl + his heirs in their appointment + levies (13)

1534 Gerald, 9th Earl of Kildare, dies in Tower of London (Chambers)

1537 Silken Thomas, 10th Earl of Kildare, hanged drawn + quartered with his 5 uncles at Tyburn Hill. (Chambers)

End of the Kildare Geraldines.

1570 4 Masters record that the valley of the Maive was wasted by the Earl of Ormonde (Black earl) without opposition because the 2 Desmonds were then in prison in London (14)

1574-80 Gerald the 15th Earl sacked Youghal (Chambers)

1579 Massacre at Dun an Oir.

1583 Gahet, 16th Earl of Desmond, killed at Cileanageerty (40) RH 48-52 67-9 139-141

1589c Plantation of Munster ⁷²⁻⁷⁵ RH 58-60

16 Cromwellian Plantation

Sir William Herbert of Monmouth 73 } Lord of the Island Castle
Lord Herbert of Chesham his son in law.

41. 6 Undertakers from Barragela to Clowdagh and from Mountage to the foot of Slieve Mish.
