The generosity of Miss Clarissa Hussey was largely responsible for the erection of the sacred edifice of which the foundation stone was laid in 1861.

A white marble tablet in the church describes Miss Hussey as "a most beautiful benefactress to the religious + charitable institutions of her native town".

Mr. Foley, however, does not hesitate to state that "she was amongst the worst type of landowners in the county"; and that "her unfortunate tenants had to do the scariest work on the farm for herself + bailiff without payment or the labour being allowed in the new History of Corkaguiney pp 183-4

Miss Hussey died in Cork where she had resided for a number of years, in her 84th year. Her remains were brought to Tralee, and afterwards to Dingle, her native place.

As the remains reached Dingle, we read in a local paper, "the procession gradually grew larger. Within 2 miles of the Town, the boys of the Christian Brothers' Schools, and the girls of the Presentation Convent School, robed in white dresses + black scarfs, joined the procession, marching in front of the hearse".

The remains were taken to the new church which was not then completely finished and a Requiem Mass celebrated before a temporary altar.

Doctor Moriarty announced that High Mass would be celebrated annually, for the repose of Miss Hussey's soul, on Aug. 18.

The chief mourners were the nephews of the deceased lady - Edward and Samuel M. Hussey, who afterwards attained an enviable notoriety as a landlord and land agent.

There are some fine buildings due largely to the generosity of Miss Clarissa Hussey, a native of the Town, including the Catholic Church, the Presentation Convent and schools, and the Monastery + well-equipped schools of the Christian Brothers.

Blasket Islands

572 A rent of £4 for the grass of a cow, which few of them possessed, was at one time, imposed on the islanders, but, through the intercession of Fr. John Nagan P.P., the rent was reduced to £1 on the expiration of the period when Miss Hussey ceased to act as "middleman" between the tenants and the Earl of Cork.
