- 20 S. of the river ^{known as} Desmond. M^cCarthy Mor reigned supreme
Owned W. half of Conk + S. $\frac{1}{2}$ of Kerry
- ✓ Earl of Desmond owned from Dungarvan to The Blaskets.
Maine boundary between Kerry + Desmond.
- 21 M^cCarthy More had Castlemaire for the first year.
- ✓ 22 Castlemaire built by Maurice Fitzgerald about 1215.
also built castles at Callinacorney + Melakiffe.
1357 Maurice Oge, 2nd son of Desmond died suddenly
at Castlemaire and was buried at Tralee
- ✓ 23 1567 Lord Dep. Sidney arrested Desmond at Kilwallock
and sent him with his brother to the Tower.
- ✓ 1570 Sir John Perrott made Lord President of Munster Towards
the close of 1570
He ravaged the Desmond Palatinate from end to end.
- 23 1571 Summoned the chieftains to meet him at Castlemaire
on the feast of St. John the Baptist.
- ✓ James Fitzmaurice placed a constable + ward in the ^{castle} castle.
- ✓ The garrison stubbornly held out + Perrott departed
- ✓ 27 1572 June Perrott again before the walls
12 weeks white flag of surrender garrison set free.
- ✓ 30 1573 Spring Fitzmaurice submitted to Perrott at Kilwallock.
Perrott recalled to England.
Sailed for Youghal in Sept.
- ✓ 30 1570 Earl transferred to mayor of Dublin
31-2 Nicholas Walsh's letter
- ✓ 34 1573 24 Dec. Castle retaken
- 34 Countess Clarencity, Desmond's sister
- ✓ 49-50 28 Dec 1573 Earl's letter to Walsh
- 50 1574 31 Jan - Elizabeth's letter to Fitzwilliam
Earl of Essex + Kildare treat with Desmond
- ✓ 1 August - Proclamation £1000 + pension of £40 for life
- ✓ 3 Sept. Earl submitted to the Lord Deputy at Cashel
- ✓ Proclamation cancelled. Earl disbanded forces
- ✓ Castlemaire handed up to Capt. Apsley
- ✓ 1578 15 Feb. - Desmond petitioned for return of Castlemaire

✓ 55 1579 15 July Sir James Fitzmaurice, with 6 Spanish vessels
entered Dingle harbour.
Next day around by Sleah Head To Smerwick

✓ 58 Sir William Winter
on board the Revenge
in the roads of Ventry

✓ 58 1580 On July 17 Pelham proceeded through Duballow,
Newmarket, Ardaraugh, Condal, and reached
Kilcussar, 2 miles east of C. Island, that evening.

✓ Got word that Desmonds' cattle were being driven
from Castleisland towards the hills.

✓ He followed + took 1,500 cattle
He nearly captured the earl, countess + Saunders

July 18 - To Castlemaire

July 19 Inch

July 20 Dingle

July 21 Fort del Ore

July 23 Returned to Castlemaire

Stay 2 days

July 26 - Towards Cork - camped by the Lough.

July 24 Pelham wrote to Sir Henry Wallop

25 Tuns of Cascon Wine + sack + biscuit

✓ 60 1580 Drury died in September. Replaced by Pelham.

✓ At the end of August ~~Bingle~~ ^{Admiral} Winter moved southwards

✓ 62 Knight of Kerry had a castle at Galkanas.

✓ 62 13 Sept Andrew Martin, constable Castlemaire, Pres. of Munster,
then in Cork, wrote to St. Leger, telling him that he had that day
received from the Knight of Kerry news that
Spaniards had arrived in Smerwick

✓ Ormond rushed to Dingle with Martin.
Martin killed + Ormond retreated

- ✓ 63 ^{Aug 12} Lord Deputy Grey came to Dublin Aug 12
- ✓ 64 His troops ambushed at Cahir by Ballinpass
7 Nov
Went by Limerick to Suedwick
- ✓ 65 Cleston appointed constable of Castlemaine
Pardon to all bar Desmond - may fell off

1583 March - Countess left earl - probably at his request

May - earl passed by Castlemaine - no food or Powder
Edward Spring vice - constable supplied
the necessary.

- 66 O'mend ordered Spring to be tried for Treason
before him at Limerick.
Spring submitted + was freed.

9 Nov. 1583 (SAT) The Earl went westward from Glomaneenta
beyond Traamore ^{Blenerville} to Derrymore Wood near Burren
sent 2 horsemen CROHORE SCORRY, JOHN DAILY + 8 KERNES
Earl, JOHN McElligott + 2 or 3 footmen stayed at Derrymore

Owen Moriarty
examination
before Ormond
26 Nov.

Cahir-Ni-FAHYE, beyond Castlegregory Castle
Moriarty's herchuen of Ormond's
from Maurice Mac Eoin, and Robert Mac Redmond
40 cows, 9 horses, goods + household stuff
stripped naked Maurice wife children
1. Maurice sent word to brother in law
Owen McDonil Moriarty and his brother Donnil at CASTLE DRUM
2. Colonel Stanley in Dingle - follow cattle
get help from Castlemaine

68 Owen went to Castlemaine - Captain Claxton gave 5 soldiers

10 Nov 1583 (SUN)

Foot soldiers
headpieces
darts or javelins
swords
Knives
bagpipes

^{2 Pipers}
Donnil + 18 Kernes west from CASTLE DRUM by foot of Slieve Mish
met Owen + proceeded towards Tralee
crossed the river at TRAAMORE (now Blenerville)
found the track of the cattle
soldiers hump back
Owen promised 2 beef if cattle were recovered
If not 1 of his own beef
Reached Ballinacorney by daylight
Continued by moonlight to Glomaneenta
camped for the night
Owen + Donnil went on reconnaissance
Saw fire and cabin but cattle had not yet arrived
Postponed attack until cattle ~~was~~ would arrive

11 Nov. 1583 (Mon)

Owen, Donill + soldier (Daniel & Kelly)

Kernes

4 soldiers

rushed to the hut shouting

all escaped except an old man

Owen chased the escapees

Kelly followed by Kernes + soldiers

inflicted a deep wound on the old man's arm

I am the Earl of Desmond. Spare me!

Owen returned

Donill took Earl on his back. Soon got tired

Cattle + Earl's party appearing.

Daniel Kelly cut out of the Earl's head

Owen + Donill took possession of the head

made haste to Castlemaine

2

14 Dec. 1585

Her majesty ordered that

her well beloved subject + soldier, Daniel Kelly,

who slew the late Traitor, Desmond,

for his very good services therein,

should have at least for 30 years, without fail,

as much of her lands, spiritual or Temporal,

as should amount to £30 sterling per annum

Kelly was afterwards hanged at Tyburn for highway robbery.

They gave up the head to Cleston

till they had made themselves ready to bring the same to the Lord General

Colonel P

Then they sent word to Lieutenant Stanley

Smith says the body continued to be moved for 8 weeks

finally laid to rest at Kilarnamara.

Beside an angle of the old road - Bóter an Iarla -
within the wood

to the right as you descend

is shown the site on which the cabin stood;

and further down,

in a recess at the opposite side,

is the spot where, Tradition tells, the Earl was beleaguered.

It is believed he was ~~buried~~ buried where the body lay.

70/71 Earl of Ormond
28 Nov. 1583 he writes

71 "I do send Her Highness
(for proof of the good success of the service + the happy end thereof)
by this bearer,
The principal Traitor Desmond's head
as the best token of the same,
and proof of my faithful service and travail."

71 There was a feeble voice heard protesting against
the partition of the Desmond Palatinate
by an individual who claimed to be the rightful owner of these lands.
They did not belong to Gerrard beleaded at Gloumascanta;
He ^{Gerald} was not the eldest brother
though he usurped the lands and title.
Sir Thomas of Desmond who now speaks
was the eldest brother and rightful owner.

72 After Desmond's death
the Constable - Captain Chester
claimed the reward for the capture of the Earl,
but did not receive it.

71 28 Apr 1586 Parliament
The Earl was attainted ~~and~~
and his lands declared confiscate
