

ROADS IN 1822

- CORK:** VIA CORDAL & KNOCKNABOUL.
THIS ROAD IS OFTEN REFERRED TO AS THE MILITARY ROAD AS IT WAS BUILT BY ELIZABETHAN SOLDIERS.
IT WAS ALSO KNOWN AS THE BUTTER ROAD.
IT DID NOT GO THROUGH BALLYDESMOND, WHY NOT ?
- LIMERICK:** VIA THE PRESENT COLLEGE ROAD & GLOUNSHAROON.
- LISTOWEL:** VIA POUND ROAD.
- TRALEE:** VIA TRALEE ROAD. THE OLD ROAD WAS ALMOST CERTAINLY ALSO IN EXISTENCE AT THAT TIME.
- KILLARNEY:** VIA BARRACK LANE, CURROW & THE MOUNTAIN ROAD.
THIS IS CLEARLY SHOWN ON A TAYLOR & SKINNER MAP OF 1783.
T.M. DONOVAN IN HIS "POPULAR HISTORY OF EAST KERRY", TELLS US THAT, UP TO 1831, BARRACK LANE BRIDGE WAS THE ONLY BRIDGE ACROSS THE MAINE (PP.142,187).
- SCARTAGLEN:** VIA BARRACK LANE
NIMMO'S MAP OF 1812 GIVES THE ROUTE AS THROUGH, KILLEGANE, COOLAVANNY, BAWNASKEYH & COOLNAGERAGH.
THIS IS CONFIRMED BY T.M. DONOVAN (P.187)
THE FIRIA - BREAHEG ROAD CONNECTION WAS MADE IN 1880-81.
